This strategy will help us to harness more of the benefits of the arts and creativity. It gives us a structure to weave creative projects into the way we work throughout our hospitals in Hull and East Yorkshire.

ARTS IN OUR HOSPITAL ENVIRONMENTS

Whether you're a patient, visitor or a staff member, the places that surround us influence how we feel.

Bright and colourful? Cool and calming? Warm and welcoming? Spaces that look good also feel good.

It's common sense, and the evidence backs this up. In hospitals where wards, corridors, waiting rooms and treatment spaces are artistically designed and decorated, people feel more relaxed, need less medication and even recover faster.

- Work with patients, visitors and staff to understand what different wards need, and to design welcoming environments that are tailor-made for the people who use them.

PROJECTS FOR PEOPLE

Being in hospital can be worrying, so anything that cheers us up, takes our mind off our concerns, and makes us feel like ourselves again can really help.

The evidence shows us that music, art, writing and other creative activities - at the bedside, in waiting and treatment rooms - can help people feel better, and get better.

Our hospitals already have brilliant play therapists and activity specialists who make a difference every day. We want to build on this by working with artists too.

WE ARE INSPIRED BY CREATIVE HEALTHCARE PROJECTS ALL OVER THE UK:

- Projects to create fun, funky, personally-decorated zimmer frames that encourage older people to use them more, result in 60% fewer falls!
- One-to-one art sessions for patients receiving chemotherapy help make things easier.
- Music in waiting rooms a really simple idea and one that most London hospitals have been doing for years. Music to energise, calm or relax.

CREATIVE THINKING CAN HELP SOLVE SOME OF OUR CLINICAL CHALLENGES, AND WE WANT TO WORK WITH MORE ARTS PROFESSIONALS TO DO MORE OF THIS

Our 'Talking Pictures' project has already been a great success:

Our speech and language therapists work with stroke patients to help them improve their language skills. They use picture tools to get patients talking and describing what they see. These images were very dated, unstimulating, and few other options were available in the UK.

To solve this problem, we worked with Hull artist and illustrator Simon Crook, to create new, interesting, colourful and up-to-date images that get our patients talking. Patients and therapists love the new pictures – everyone is telling us how great they are!

It's been such a success that we'll be doing more speech and language image projects like this. In the future, we also plan to share these images with other NHS Trusts throughout the UK, so that other patients can get talking too.

TO CREATE MORE PROJECTS THAT BENEFIT OUR PATIENTS, WE PLAN TO:

- Work with artists, patients, carers and staff to create a programme of imaginative creative projects – at bedsides, in treatment rooms, on wards, in waiting rooms and corridors.
- Partner with brilliant arts professionals and creative organisations, like galleries and museums to bring the very best creative projects to our hospitals.
- Work with artists and creative professionals to find new creative solutions to clinical challenges.
